## Kim's Comments

The new year brought many changes for ALSO; our Children's Program closed, we said good-bye to Farzana and Mina, our exceptional early childhood educators, and we dove back into event planning.

The loss of ALSO's Children's Program is felt by all of the member organizations at Heartwood House. EcoEquitable and the Community Laundry Coop were our primary partners outside of the ALSO students. We are not alone, struggling in this climate of funding cuts, reallocations and realignment. The Community Laundry Coop also closed its doors this week. Both programs had



been running for over 20 years. Both programs served underrepresented groups including families living in poverty. Both programs will be greatly missed in our community.

ALSO's Board of Directors updated our strategic plan in the Fall of 2023 to re-imagine our way forward. In order to build capacity and resiliency for ALSO, we need to raise \$20,000 each year. No small task.

It would be easy to get caught in the challenges of running a small charitable organization; the gaps in funding, the very lean budget and the 'jack of all trades' role that Executive Directors, staff and Board members often need to play. Instead, I choose to see, really see, the good work we are doing each day. I come in to work and am greeted warmly by the wonderful teaching team at ALSO. I walk into the classroom to see the teachers working closely with students. I see smiles. I see genuine caring and commitment to this small, but mighty organization. I overhear hard conversations. I observe the teachers providing support, as each student works towards their individual goals. We lean in. We lean in with each other. We lean in with the students. Our Board of Directors leans in supporting our mission and safe-guarding our future.

We will continue our good work in the Ottawa community. We will continue to change and adapt. Small, but mighty indeed.

### ALSO's Banned Book Night fundraiser on April 12, 2024 was a great success. We raised just over \$11,000!

The idea for Banned Book Night came from conversations we have had about ALSO. We work with adults who feel that they don't fit into more mainstream programs. We work with adults who, often, have struggled to find their voice or their place. Books that have been formally banned or 'shadow' banned are stories that need to be told. The authors and their stories should have a place and should be accessible to everyone and anyone. We need these stories. ALSO's Banned Book Night celebrates the authors and the stories that others have tried to silence.

The evening was entertaining, informative and educational. **'Nathan Burgoine**, **Kate Heartfield** and **Dr. Nili Kaplan-Myrth** read excerpts from their chosen banned books.

'Nathan read from *Suicide Notes* by Michael Thomas Ford. Kate read from *Salma Writes a Book* by Danny Ramadan. Nili and her daughter read from *Diary of a Young Girl* by Anne Frank. **Denise Deshaw** signed an excerpt from *And Tango Makes Three* by Justin Richardson and Peter Parnell, illustrated by Henry Cole. The audience engagement was excellent with much discussion following each reading.

With 80 tickets sold, it was a full house. We were very fortunate to have **Christophe Elie** play his music throughout the evening. He describes his music as political folk. His performance was exceptional. Our MC, **Mark Underwood**, came from Montreal to be with us. He volunteered with ALSO many years ago. It was a pleasure to see Mark again. 
